



Dr David Bendor-Samuel is from England. He joined Wycliffe Bible Translators there in 1958, and first served with the Guajajara people of Brazil on the edge of the Amazon. After ten years analyzing their language, developing literacy materials and beginning

the translation of Scripture for them, he became the director of Wycliffe in the UK. Subsequently he became a member of Wycliffe's international leadership team based in Dallas, TX. Prior to his retirement in January '09, he has traveled, taught and served as a consultant to the Wycliffe and SIL worldwide family of organizations for the last thirty years.

Dr Bendor-Samuel's ministry has been primarily focused on Biblical conflict resolution since 1999, when he was introduced to Peacemaker Ministries. With their help and encouragement, he has expanded and customized that organization's training for use by Wycliffe and other missionary societies. He is a certified Christian Conciliator and continues to serve Wycliffe and Peacemaker Ministries as a trainer and mentor at a reduced level as a retired person.



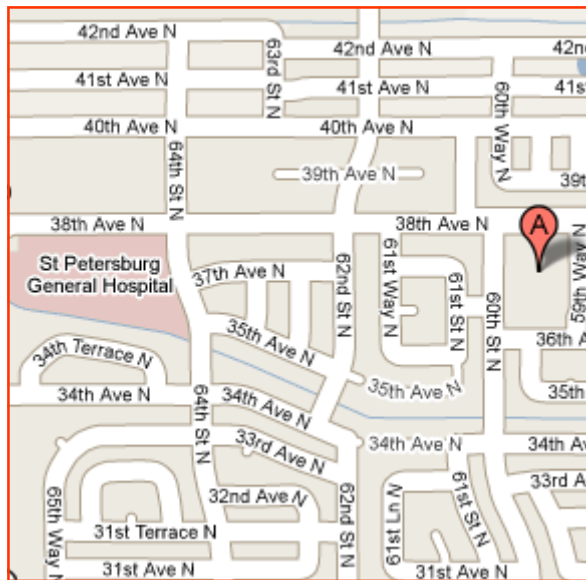
Beate Knauber is from Germany. She and her husband have been with Wycliffe Bible Translators since 1982. They went to Papua New Guinea in 1988 to live and work among the Dawawa people, a remote language group in the mountains. Their program started out as

a traditional one with language work, translation, literacy and later teachers' training. Beate also did a lot of medical work in the village as a licensed nurse. In 1998 the Knaubers completed a hymn book and in 2003 the NT in Dawawa.

After the dedication of the NT they served as regional directors overseeing 20 language teams. In this capacity they also initiated and directed a multi language project for three years. Being in a leadership position made the Knaubers very aware that conflicts often arise among Christians and Beate found herself frequently helping resolve those situations. Around that time she was first introduced to the Peacemaker courses by Wycliffe member Dr. David Bendor-Samuel who came to PNG to hold training classes there. He encouraged Beate to be enrolled in the Certification Program to become a Certified Conciliator with Peacemaker Ministries. She hopes to complete the program within the next two years. The Knaubers have been temporarily assigned to the US and are currently living in St. Petersburg, Florida.

Basic Seminar: April 3-4

The primary goal is to challenge and equip individuals to deal with conflicts according to the principles provided in the Scriptures.

The material applies equally to conflict prevention, dealing with conflict at an early stage of its development, and dealing with it when it has become a serious problem.

The format combines short presentations of core teaching elements with highly interactive small group participation using adult learning principles. Video clips, flipcharts, stories, scenarios and power-point are used. Trainees are provided with a workbook containing the basic DCB material to which they can add personal notes.

Preparation for the Basic Seminar

In preparation for this training we ask you to do two things.

FIRST: please pray that God will bless us during this seminar. Many people have found the material to be profoundly impactful – some have described it as **life-changing**. Pray for yourself personally and pray also for your fellow-participants and the trainers.

SECOND: please bring with you your **Bible** and **notes** on one or two conflicts in which you have been personally involved, either as a party or in trying to help parties in conflict.

If possible, include, for each one:

- the cause(s), both on the surface and underlying.
- the way things developed over time: initial incidents, later deterioration, etc.
- what was key in how/why it was resolved or not resolved.
- any lessons you learned from the experience.
- These notes will give you something specific to which you can relate the principles which will be discussed during the seminar. There will be times for personal application during the presentation of the ABC's when you will be invited to reflect on the conflict situation you wrote up or one you are currently facing.

Coaching Workshop: April 6-7

Learning to Help Others Informally

Pre-requisites: Each participant must have completed the Basic Seminar before attending the Coaching Workshop.

The goal of the workshop is to prepare participants for informally helping friends to engage in conflict resolution. Core teaching will be given, accompanied by demos and discussion. Each participant will practice these new skills using mini-role-plays during day one of the workshop. Debriefing after each role-play enables participants to gauge their strengths and consider areas that may require additional work.

Day two builds on skills learned during day one by participation in two major role-plays, each followed by debriefing, reinforcement of biblical principles and group discussion.
